Bay Hills Community Association President's Message

Bay Hills received a **letter of appreciation** from a non-resident who came here to see the **luminary display** on Christmas Eve. They have been admiring the display for many years and even expressed the regret when we were rained out two years ago. They also admired the tradition that we have had for over thirty years.

In case you haven't heard, the **Mill Creek pumping station** is working again and the creek and Magothy River have been reopened for public use and fishing. The December 17th break in the wastewater line is covered in more detail in Cathleen Vitale's letter. I will be attending a public meeting in early February where the Anne Arundel County Public Works will present information about response and repair efforts, environmental assessments and remedial plans. If you would like to attend also, the date is February 9 at 7:00 pm at Anne Arundel Community College at room 101 of the Florestano Building.

On Sunday night, January 15th, **racist writings** were distributed to most or all of the single family homes in Bay Hills. Parts of Saint Margaret and Cape Saint Claire also

received copies of these rantings. The police have been notified, and as a matter of fact, had copies when I talked to them. Although the products distributed appeared to be both hate and pornographic writings, the police said that they were not prosecutable. I

Welcome: Two welcome bags were delivered to new residents.

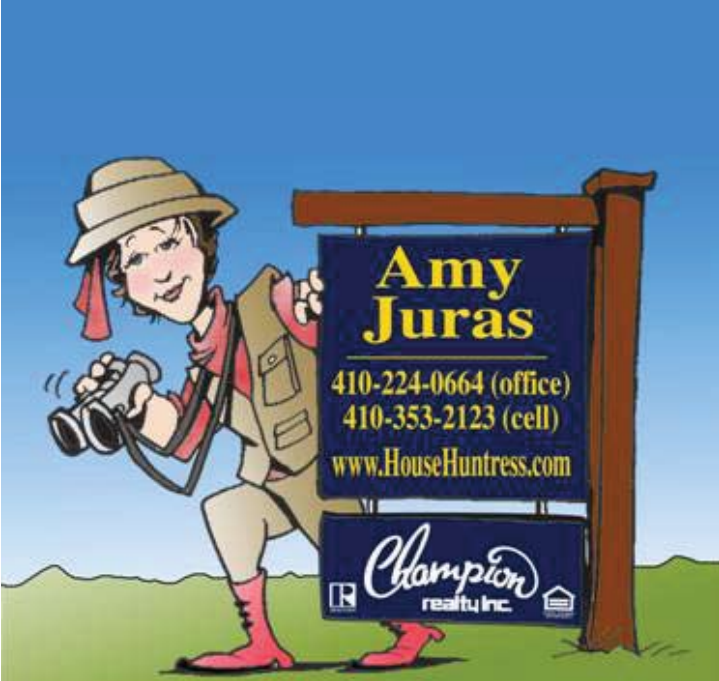
OLD BUSINESS

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What Happened at Mill Creek

County Council In Action - January 2006

Well the New Year finally made it - as if we could have stopped it. I hope everyone had an opportunity to enjoy a safe and happy holiday season. For me, the end of 2005 meant the changing of the guard at the Council; Ed Reilly (District 7) was elected Chairman, and yours truly was elected to serve as Vice Chairman. As with all new titles comes additional work, concerns, and worries, but your Council leadership is up to the task. As we enter the last year of this term, the

Council will continue to move forward to address funding needs, infrastructure shortfalls and educational plans.

The end of the year also brought about an environmental nightmare for the County and the citizens of our district. By now, most of you have read the articles or seen the news clips regarding the Mill Creek pumping station malfunction. For those who were away, the following is a bit of old news.

On December 19th, I was notified there had been a major fault in the wastewater line serving the Mill Creek Pumping Station. The result was nothing short of a catastrophe as millions of gallons of raw sewage flowed into Mill Creek. When I arrived on site, I was dumbfounded to find a crater, the size of a small

pond swallowing up grass, mud and, yes, trees. The erosion of dirt had caused the pumping station to fill with mud and debris and ultimately shut down.

The Mill Creek pumping station is a prime example of the aging facilities we have in Anne Arundel County. Originally built in 1973 with then state-of-the-art technology, the station has suffered from repeated problems, including odor and fumes to mechanical failures, third party breaches and now the collapse of the 36" sewer line.

Including this latest spill, there have been more than two dozen separate spills into the waterway. Since the early 90's, the County has spent several million dollars to upgrade the systems to prevent overflow from reaching the river. The latest spill - more than 3,000,000 gallons - is by far the most devastating. So what do we do? There are two immediate concerns.

The first is to not only fix the broken line but to go further 'upstream' in the system and replace additional sections of the pipeline that inspections have shown may have been compromised. Corrosion inside the lines appears to be the culprit. According to conversations with Department of Public Works employees, when the Mill Creek Station was put into service and the concrete piping was used, it was the newest and safest technology. Now, it appears it is susceptible to "sewer gases," which corrode away the concrete.

Residents will be able to see where the repair and replacement work is progressing as it requires above ground "by-pass" lines, usually blue in color laid along the public roadways. With so much of the County's system made from these concrete pipes, one has to wonder whether we can repair and replace before another major spill.

The second concern, and perhaps the one most effecting local residents, is what has this done to Mill Creek and the Magothy. Since the spill several environmental agencies, as well as individuals, have been involved in testing the waterways. Among the concerns are: to what level and extent the water is contaminated with algae and bacteria, and what steps will be needed to restore Mill Creek wetlands.

Plans are currently underway to implement a sediment removal plan in the affected areas. Sediment removal and a containment system have been approved by the Maryland Department of the Environment. I have spoken with officials from the Department of the Environment about possible dredging in the most effective areas to remove phosphates in the sediments.

In the coming weeks, my office, the Department of Public Works, the Health Department and others from the County will be holding a town meeting to discuss Mill Creek, the pumping station and what happens next. Notification will likely be by press release and contact to the community associations who have expressed an interest in participating. Have You Paid Your 2006 Annual Dues?

If you are selling a residence in Bay Hills, you are **required by law** to purchase a resale packet from the Bay Hills Community Association. The packet contains our bylaws, covenants and community regulations. It must be furnished to the buyer prior to sale closing. The BHCA will confirm if there is any balance due on the homeowner's account before releasing the packet. Sellers are expected to clear their BHCA accounts prior to selling their home. Anne Arundel County Opens Medicare Part D Assistance Center

Anne Arundel County Executive Janet S. Owens will announce the opening of a specialized senior citizens help center in the County. The new Medicare Prescription Drug Card process has been difficult for many senior citizens, and this Assistance

Center will be available to answer questions specific to Medicare Part D.

"While some local senior citizens have family or friends to help with the difficult paper work, many do not, and the real tragedy is when low-income seniors are left to fend for themselves," said County Executive Owens.

The Medicare Part D Assistance Center will allow County Seniors to come in, free of charge, and work with professionals from the Department of Aging and Disabilities to get the best prescription coverage for their needs. "Our goal is to provide the assistance needed by Medicare beneficiaries so that they can make informed and timely decisions that will prevent them from finding themselves in a crisis situation after May 15th," said Department of Aging and Disabilities Director Virginia Thomas.

The Medicare Part D Assistance Center is located at 2666 Riva Road in the Heritage Office Complex, suite #110. A press conference to mark the opening was held Friday, January 27th, 2006.

"Do Not Call" List: Should You Register Your Cell Phone Number?

The Federal government created the National Do Not Call Registry to make it easier and more efficient for you to stop getting telemarketing calls you don't want. You can register online at WWW.DONOTCALL.GOV or call toll-free, 1-888-382-1222 (TTY 1-866-290-4236), from the number you wish to register. Registration is free.

The Federal Trade Commission, the Federal Communications Commission, and the states are enforcing the National Do Not Call Registry. Placing your number on the registry will stop most, but not all, telemarketing calls.

You may place your personal cell phone number on the National Do Not Call Registry. The registry has accepted cell phone numbers since it opened for registrations in June 2003. There is no deadline to register a home or cell phone number on the Registry.

You may have received an email telling you that your cell phone is about to be assaulted by telemarketing calls as a result of a new cell phone number database; however, that is not the case. FCC regulations prohibit telemarketers from using automated dialers to call cell phone numbers. Automated dialers are standard in the industry, so most telemarketers don't call consumers on their cell phones without their consent.

Note that contrary to what some variants of the email rumor claim, there is no deadline for adding cell phone numbers (or any number) to the list — numbers may be added at any time.

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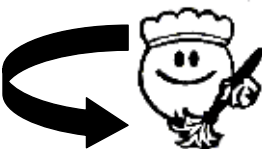
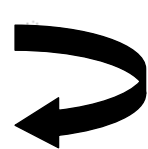

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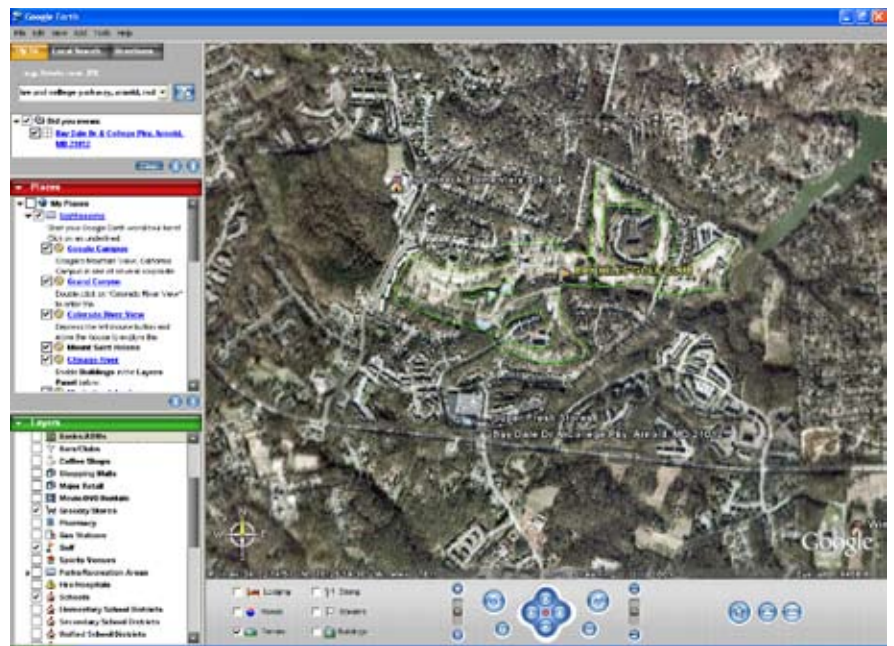
Just for Fun - Google Earth: <http://earth.google.com>

There are a number of online mapping sites available on the web, including Mapquest, Yahoo! maps, and many, many more. There is also a relatively new software tool that combines mapping, aerial imagery and "virtual flying," in a way that is fun, informative, and - to many - quite addictive. It is called Google Earth™.

Google Earth is Google's new satellite imagery-based mapping product that combines global coverage of imagery with new navigational features including integrated Google search capabilities. It is based on technology from Keyhole, a company acquired by Google in October 2004. Google Earth is a broadband mapping tool that enables users to fly from space to street level views to find geographic information, and to explore places around the world.

It is essentially a globe that sits inside your PC. You point and zoom to anyplace on the planet that you want to explore. Satellite images and local facts zoom into view. Tap into Google search to show local points of interest and facts. Zoom to a specific address to check out an apartment or hotel. View driving directions and even fly along your route.

Google Earth is a free downloadable application for personal use. Users can also choose to buy one



of two paid services. The paid versions offer a variety of tools for measuring, drawing, saving, printing and GPS device support.

The image shown here is of Bay Hills, with only a few of the layers turned on. While most users do not need any "instruction" to begin using the software once it is installed, the web site provides many suggestions for enhancing your experience. Try it out ... we haven't yet met anyone who was not impressed (and entertained) by Google Earth.

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Financial Focus: Don't Be a "Groundhog Day" Investor

This month, the spotlight is on Punxsutawney Phil, the world's most famous groundhog. As the folklore goes, if Phil sees his shadow, he anticipates six more weeks of bad weather, and he retreats underground. If the day is cloudy, he thinks it's spring and he stays above ground. Of course, many of us would say that Phil is never right. If you live on the East Coast, or in the Midwest or the Great Plains states, you probably don't view the weather as "springlike" in early February, or six weeks later, either. But Phil is not alone in reliving his errors. Many investors also keep making the same mistakes, year after year.

How can you avoid being a "Groundhog Day" investor? Here are a few suggestions:

Don't chase after "hot stocks." You can find "hot stocks" featured in financial magazines and touted by "experts" on television. Even your next-door neighbor may have a "can't miss" tip for you. But you're probably better off by turning the pages, flipping off the television, and redirecting your neighbor to a different subject. In the first place, by the time you even hear about a hot stock - much less buy one - it may already be cooling off. And, more importantly, it just may not be appropriate for your needs. For example, if you already have several stocks quite similar to the "hot" one, you may find that adding it to your portfolio may not boost your diversification - which is essential to investment success.

Don't "buy and sell" too frequently. If you don't hold stocks for at least a year before selling them, your profits (if there are any) will be based on your current income tax rate, rather than

the capital gains rate, which is likely to be more favorable. You're much better off buying high-quality investments and holding them for the long term, until either your needs, or the investments themselves, have changed.

Don't load up on company stock. If you have confidence in your employer, you might be tempted to put a good percentage of your 401(k) dollars in company stock - but this move could be a big mistake. To look at an extreme example, nearly 58 percent of Enron employees' 401(k) assets were invested in Enron stock as it fell 98.8 percent in value during 2001, according to the National Association of Securities Dealers (NASD). But even after the fall of Enron, many employees have maintained even larger percentages of their 401(k) assets in their company stock. Don't make that mistake. Instead, diversify your 401(k) dollars among your various investment choices in a way that reflects your risk tolerance, long-term goals and time horizon.

Don't stop investing when the market goes down. The financial markets will always go through "ups" and "downs." Some people bail out when the going gets tough, preferring to wait until things turn around. But the most successful investors continue to invest through good times and bad - and, if they choose good investments, and hold them for the long term, they are frequently rewarded.

By following these tips, you can avoid making those repetitive investment mistakes that can prove so costly. And even it's cloudy this Groundhog Day, your financial future can look sunny indeed.

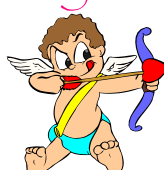
