There has been a lot of painting on the lawns, driveways, and streets in Bay Hills lately. It has been done to mark existing power, cable, and water lines to prevent Verizon contractors from cutting them. Verizon is installing their fiber optic lines through our community. We don't have a projected finish time yet. If any problems occur, the first contact should be made to the contractor. Their phone number should be in large numbers on the sides of their trucks as required by the county. NTL is the construction contractor and their number is 1-866-796-7770. I think the Verizon work may be delaying the repaving of Bay Green Drive also. Most or all of the curbing repairs and new curb cuts for crosswalks have been completed.

There is also quite a bit of repaving in the community. Pine Valley and Oakland Hills Apartments should have completed repaving by now. You could tell when the work was done by the extra number of cars parked

on Bay Green Drive. Also a neighbor, Oakmont, on Bay Dale Drive across from the shopping center completed repaving recently.

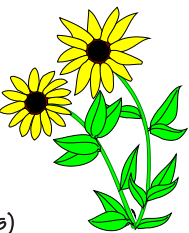

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Bits and Pieces: A Little Bit About a Lot of Things

County Council In Action - May 2006

Well it's May, and that means budget month for Anne Arundel County Council. As most of you know, the County Council receives the budget from the County Executive on May 1st each year. Prior to that time, we have no idea what she (or he) is going to provide to meet the needs of the citizens of our County. Will money go into school construction? What about roads (anyone driven College Parkway lately)? While I anticipate a budget that provides for more than a billion dollars

in operating and capital expenses, the details will have to wait for the next column since public hearings have been scheduled for May 8th (Chesapeake Arts Center) and May 10th (Arundel Center, Annapolis). At that time, public testimony will be taken regarding any issue relating to budgetary items, the tax rate and other accompanying budget bills. Of course, our regular monthly meetings will continue on the 1st and 3rd Monday night to handle the business of the Council.

Last month the Council passed the Scenic and Historic Roads Bill, (sponsored by yours truly), a piece of legislation that dates back to 1997, when a list was created which designated various roads throughout the County as either scenic, historic or both. The purpose of the designation was to provide protec-

tion or preservation to the roads against development, which would be inconsistent with the surrounding area. There are approximately 14 points, which relate to scenic and historic roads and development. They are listed in the County Code in section 17-6-504. For example, if a road were so designated, structures and roads would need to be designed to retain the open character of the site and to minimize the impact of the development on views from the road; development would have to minimize tree and vegetation removal and protect existing vegetation adjacent to the road; entrance features shall be low, open, and in keeping with the scenic or historic character of the surrounding area and the development would need to preserve the existing forest, tree canopy, foreground meadow, pasture, crop land, and other natural screening and shall be designed to place development in the background as viewed from the road. As a result of the legislation, several roads in Severna Park, Arnold and Broadneck now hold this designation.

The Council has also been working on legislation requiring the establishment of a Veterans Commission. Many other counties already have such legislation in place, and the council, spearheaded by Councilman Middlebrooks, took up this important issue. With the status of Crownsville up in the air, delegates, senators and council members hoping to have a veterans home

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Out & About in Bay Hills: Notes on Property and Grounds Beautification and Maintenance

As you have probably noticed by now, the community's grounds maintenance and landscaping efforts have begun in earnest for 2006. The early spring warmth and more recent rains have kicked off the official growing season.

With our landscaping contractor agreement up for renewal, the BHCA conducted a thorough bidding and review process over the past winter. We reviewed three proposals and chose to award the contract to G.P. Lawn and Custom Landscaping, who we have used for most of the last three years.

The contract renewal process began last September when Gordon Pollock, principal of G.P. Landscaping, agreed to give us a walkthrough of all the work he was doing in each of the common recreational areas we own and maintain. Gordon pointed out his work by area and provided maintenance and repair/improvements suggestions to Dave Eckels (Property and Grounds Committee Chair) and Lois Findlay (Treasurer).

From this walkthrough, Lois drafted a Grounds Maintenance and Landscaping Plan for the Board's review. At the time, there was no formal contract in place with G.P. Landscaping that detailed the work to be done. Rather, the agreement was guided by a one-page proposal. This agreement had been renewed twice and was up for renewal again. The Board agreed that a formal contract which specified the tasks, frequency and costs was needed. They also required a bidding process be conducted prior to awarding a new contract. The Plan was used to estimate a realistic budget for Grounds Maintenance and Landscaping, which was presented to and approved by the community at the Annual Meeting in October. In prior years, the budget for these areas was underestimated compared to what the community has been spending.

With the Board's input on the plan and the approved budget, Lois created a Request for Proposals (RFP) which Dave distributed in November to several local firms that were recommended to us. Of these, we received bids from G.P. Landscaping, Stewart Lawn & Landscape, and McDonough Farms. Lois followed up with each bidder and compiled an apples-to-apples-to-apples comparison of the three bids, based on the specific work they were asked to bid on. Of the three, G.P. Landscaping's bid was by far the most responsive to our RFP in terms of providing pricing for each task as requested. As such, the Board had the most confidence in the total cost of their proposal. The Board approved their proposal at the meeting in February, and instructed Lois and Dave to complete a contract with them. Lois presented G.P. Landscaping a draft contract with their pricing/scope of work and our proposed business terms and conditions. This was negotiated and finalized with minor modifications in early March.

In the many board discussions, there were no concerns raised about the quality or timeliness of G.P. Landscaping's work. With respect the rates, they kept the increases from 2005 rates to a minimum. For example, the weekly service visit rate increased 5%, from \$300 to \$315. Other services that did not previously have contracted rates now have them. G.P. Landscaping offered to hold the rates through 2007, in exchange for

a two-year agreement. The Board agreed to this term. At about \$18K annually, this contract represents just over one-third of the Association's annual budget. The Board feels the contract has been carefully vetted, and the best vendor selected to meet our needs.

The Common Areas that are maintained under this agreement are:

1. Traffic Island at entrance on Bay Hills Drive at Shore Acres Road
2. Intersection of Bay Hills Drive and Mystic Lane
3. Tennis Court Area on Bay Hills Drive
4. Playground and Pavilion at Five Acres Park on Bay Hills Drive
5. Strip Areas on Bay Hills Drive
6. Basketball Court Area on Bay Green Drive
7. Court Recreation Area on Golf Course Drive
8. Traffic Island at entrance on Bay Dale Drive at Bay Green Drive
9. Strip Area on Bellerive near Dorado

More recently, Tennis Court Committee chairs Sally and Paul Vavrek have undertaken several initiatives this spring to improve the courts' condition and appearance. They worked with Dave Eckels and the Board to gain approval on each of

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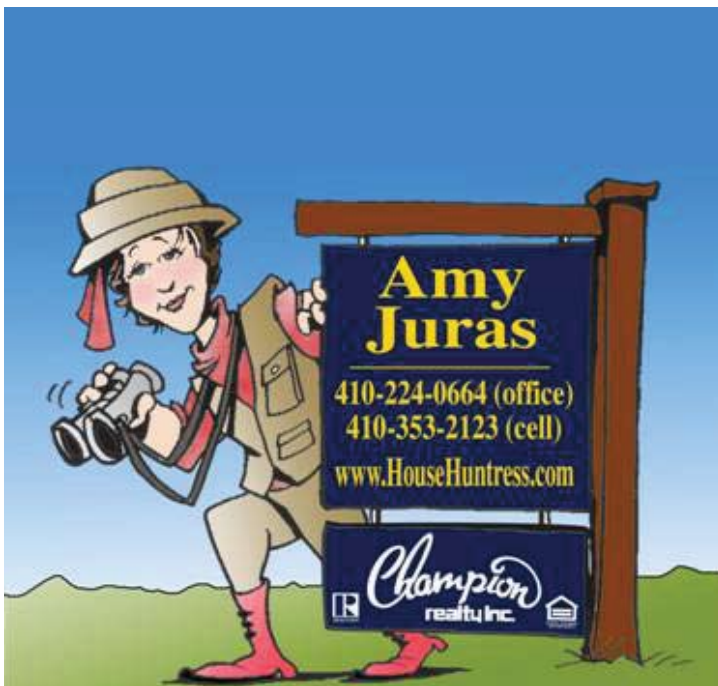

on a part of the property, and the increasing number of retired military who call Anne Arundel County home, the legislation was overdue and I am glad we are addressing this issue.

I would be remiss if I did not at least mention the Board of Education. As many of you know, the Board is in the throws of a master facilities utilization study. Each time the Board reviews the usage of County schools it sends shivers up the back of parents all over the County regarding the prospect of redistricting. I want to thank the many parents who took time away from their busy schedules to attend one of the two meetings which were "designed" to get our input as parents and community stakeholders in the proposed plans. As of yet, I have yet to hear their recommendations. It is my understanding that a presentation will be made to the Board of Education on or about June 7th. That presentation will occur during an open, regularly scheduled board meeting in which the public may attend. For many, myself included, this may be the first opportunity to hear any specific suggestions regarding the results of the study.

As a parent of a Folger McKinsey student, and past resident of Berrywood, I can tell you that throughout my lifetime, the issue of which community goes to which feeder system has always been discussed with some level of anxiety. While I, and the other members of the Council, do not have the authority to pass or defeat any Board of Education decision regarding redistricting, I can only tell you that we are listening and engaged. I have attended the meetings, scheduled special meetings with the Council and communicated my desire to keep our current feeder system alignment as it currently exists. I urge interested parents to participate in the upcoming Board meetings and to make your positions known to the members of the Board of Education. You may find your specific representatives at www.aacps.org. I have found them to be available and interested, each time I have presented them with an issue or a problem.

their recommendations. They proceeded to manage all of the procurement and do some of the repair work themselves. This effort has included leaf blowing and power washing the surfaces, filling the cracks with a special ElastiCrack compound made for tennis courts, and installing a new windscreen behind one of the courts. The Vavreks were aided by Pat Nolan, who helped research repair options with the County Recreation Department, in lieu of a costly capital investment in resurfacing. The Board greatly appreciates the effort that Sally and Paul have put into making the courts more useable and enjoyable. Contact them to obtain a key to use the courts.
