Bay Hills Community Association President's Message

The Community Clean-up involving the dumpsters went fairly well considering the swimming pool was open while the dumpsters were here. On Saturday there were a total of six dumpsters filled and removed. I wasn't available for the count on Sunday, but assumed that it was about the same. I've requested that we not have them again between Memorial Day and Labor Day to avoid conflict with pool patrons' parking.

Some letters and e-mails were received regarding the proposed traffic circle and chokers on Bay Green Drive just east of Bay Dale Drive suggesting that they were completely unnecessary. Others stated that the speed humps were also unnecessary. The reasoning behind the original installation of the speed humps in 1999 was several years of research on the best way to alleviate the speeding in Bay Hills. The community had to come up with about half the cost. The overwhelming feeling when the original seven humps were installed was that they were too few, but that was the maximum allowed for county guidelines. These guidelines take into consideration access by emergency vehicles, and trash contractors, etc.

The repaving of Bay Green Drive required the humps to be removed, but to be replaced by the county at no cost to the community.

The current situation is that speeding in the community is still an issue. Since there was a limit to the number of speed humps, other remedies were sought. In order to implement some of the other solutions the county required another survey to determine if speeding was still an issue. It was determined that it was. The average speed on Bay Green Drive ranged in different areas from 30 to 34 miles per hour. Some actual recorded speeds were high 30's and several in the 40's, up to 46 mph. These were taken on four different days between 7 to 8 am and 4:30 to 5:30 pm. The reason for more concern about the area east from Bay Dale Drive was that in recent history there have been at least seven wrecks in that area. Two parked vehicles have been totaled, several signs and mailboxes destroyed, one large electric box damaged beyond repair, and one instance of an automobile crashing into the living room of a residence. The small circle and the chokers were determined to be the best solution of

Annual dues for 2007 have been paid by 96% of homes and both apartment complexes. Bay West sent Final Notice letters to the 29 delinquent accounts in late May per the Board's direction. Total dues collected of \$43,607 include current year dues, prior year dues and late fees.

A comparison of YTD revenues (\$50,732.90) and expenses (\$29,189.15) as of 5/31/07 with the 2007 budget was provided. The expenses include a \$5,000 transfer from the operating budget to the capital reserve fund.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Communications: The Board discussed the recent postage increase and the resulting increase in cost to mail The Bay Hills

Beacon. Jennifer Waters is investigating whether it is cost effective to fold The Bay Hills Beacon, which would attain a lower postage rate but increase the handling costs at the printer. The Board also discussed the new format for the front page of The Bay Hills Beacon, which now includes e-mail addresses for Board members.

Property & Grounds Management: Pat Nolan brought pictures of trash cans available for purchase for use at the basketball court so that the Board could consider the appropriate size and weight desired. Dave Eckels is working on getting five signs: two for the basketball courts, two for the playground, and one for the new path into the Shore Acres recreation area. Wood chips will be placed on the new path into the Shore Acres recreation area. The Board also discussed that the pool will allow the community to water plants near the pool's property, so the Board may consider purchasing water hoses in the future. The Board also noted that the fence at the tennis courts requires repair. Dave Eckels agreed to inspect the Shore Acres recreation area now that access is cleared.

Traffic: The county distributed information to residents about the plans for speed humps, islands, and chokers. The county is interested in feedback and will contact anyone who sends negative feedback.

Recreation: The Board discussed the purchase of volleyballs to be left at the pool and designated as the property of Bay Hills Community Association.

OLD BUSINESS

The dumpsters are scheduled for June 9th-10th.

NEW BUSINESS

Pat Nolan will contact Judy Roblyer regarding planning the Crab Feast.

The Board discussed planting one additional crape myrtle on the island near the shopping center. The tree would replace the empty area on the island formerly occupied by the Bay Hills sign, toward the end of the island near College Parkway.

Jeff Burkhart agreed to coordinate a community outing to a Naval Academy football game in response to a flier received offering discounted group tickets. The Board discussed selecting the October 27th, 2007 game against Delaware for the outing. Anyone interested in tickets should contact Jeff Burkhart.

BROADNECK FEDERATION

Broadneck Federation is adjourned for the summer.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:20 pm. The next meeting will be July 3rd, 2007 at the Providence Center on Shore Acres Road.

Turn Down the Noise

County Council In Action - June 2007

School is out and summer is finally here. Worrying about final exams, promotional exercises and the many parties to attend is already a memory. Many are grateful for the cooler weather that has allowed us to keep our windows and doors open, enjoy a bit of fresh air, and perhaps, keep the high electric bills from air conditioning from coming quite as quick. For some though, the attempt to enjoy the outdoors has come with a bit more consternation. With these beautiful days, comes

increased noise. Not just the sounds of children playing in the back yard, or parties at the neighbors, but the increased noise of ATV's, electric and gas powered "pocket-bikes." We have all heard them, sometimes for hours at a time, and always, when you are trying to enjoy a weekend or an afternoon on your deck.

Noise issues are not new. For as long as one can remember, there have been noise "issues." As the County has grown in population, individual lots have grown smaller; families are living closer to their neighbors. Using an ATV on your farm was less likely to bother your neighbor; after all, there were thirty acres between you. In some cases today, it's more like thirty feet.

Recently the County Council was presented with a bill that sought to legislate all noise that one could find offensive. The bill, sought to limit the level of the noise that could come from an action, activity or use during a particular period of time. Unfortunately, in an attempt to be as comprehensive as possible, the bill unnecessarily prohibited necessary daytime activity. The result was that the bill failed, but not without a commitment from the County Council to take the issue on and draft legislation that would address those basic noise issues that affect our day to day quality of life, but permit those activities that have also play a role in that same quality of life.

I and several other council members have been working on a revised noise ordinance that is designed to address those noises that citizens have identified as "quality of life" hampering. Noises like amplified music after certain hours, ATV's within a certain distance of one's home, and garbage collection times. In addition, and perhaps more important that any provision, would be the authority of the Anne Arundel County Police to enforce sanctions against a person found violating the proposed provisions.

Noise ordinances are not new. The State of Maryland has had noise restrictions and regulations on the books for many years. The problem is that while certain activities are prohibited, the state law provides enforcement by the Maryland Department of the Environment. Several years ago, the state Noise Control program was de-funded, leaving no one to enforce the regulations. This new proposal, will address that problem.

While Anne Arundel County has currently a provision restricting noise, it is very limiting, and speaks to "unreasonably loud noise." Imagine trying to enforce that in a Court of law. Reasonableness is, I would suggest, in the eye, or should I say "ear" of the beholder.

I am hopeful that new legislation can be introduced in the next few weeks. As with all new legislation, once introduced, there will be time to review it and comment on the proposals, hold public hearings and vote. While I do not expect the bill to address each and every noise that a person might find annoying or offensive, it would be my hope that we can take a first step to put in place the authority to enforce what currently exists as well as any new provisions contained in the proposed ordinance. In the meantime, I have a favor to ask of all of you. As citizens of a common community, it is important that we be respectful of our neighbors and their right to enjoy their property and surroundings.

At some point, even the least offensive activity becomes offensive if it goes on for hours and hours at a time. I am reminded of that as I listen to the drone of a motorized scooter, every afternoon for two to three hours, up and down the roads of my community. At some point, it goes from alternative transportation, to a shrill sound in my ear. Take a step back; think if you listened yourself, would you be bothered by the noise? If the answer is yes, moderation...please. Have a safe summer, and I look forward to seeing you during the noise discussion.

Building a Fence, Shed or Other Structure?

The following are some guidelines regarding fences, sheds and other structures to be built on lots within the community:

- Any structure proposed to be erected upon any of the lots in the subdivision must be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval.
- The Board of Directors requires that all applications be accompanied by written statements of position concerning the request from the adjacent neighbors.
- The Board of Directors reserves the right to disapprove any submission deemed not to be in the best interest of the community as a whole.
- Fences will be approved providing they extend only to the rear line of the house. No fence is to be built so that it would project beyond the front line of any adjacent residence. The fence height is limited to six (6) feet. The fence must have a consistent finish and not be left partially painted or stained and the finished side of the fence must face the public view. No chain link fence will be approved. No fences constituting an enclosure of the front yard will be approved.

BayHillsOnline.com under the "Documents" section. All residents should have also received copies of these documents prior to settlement on their properties.

Public School Registration for 2007-2008

It is important that the school have an accurate account of all new students for 2007-2008 as early as possible so that the school system can plan appropriate teacher staffing for classrooms.

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Sun and Water Safety

Sun Safety

Did you know...

- Most sun exposure in a person's lifetime occurs before age 18?
- Exposure to the sun during childhood and adolescence plays a role in developing skin cancer in the future?
- Drowning is one of the leading causes of accidental death among children ages 1-9 in Anne Arundel County?

Summer is here and with it comes pool parties, barbecues, trips to the beach, gardening and other outdoor activities. While the sun and water feel wonderful after cold winter weather, the Department of Health reminds you to be safe. Here are some tips that can help you and your family be safe in the sun and water.

Save Your Skin

- Minimize sun exposure between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. when the sun's rays are the strongest.
- Use sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher. Apply 15-30 minutes before going outdoors and reapply after swimming or every two hours.
- Wear protective, tightly woven clothing, a broad-brimmed hat and sunglasses.
- Seek shade when outdoors.
- Do not tan with indoor light, tanning beds or sunlight. Deliberate tanning increases your chance of skin cancer.
- Make sure children six months and older are protected with sunscreen, hats and protective clothing. Infants should stay in the shade.
- Check your skin regularly for signs of skin cancer, including changes in size, shape, color or feel of birthmarks, moles and spots. If you see changes, consult your doctor.

For more information on sun safety, please contact the County's department of Health for a list of additional resources.

Water Safety

At Home:

- Never leave your child alone in or around water, including bathtubs, sinks and toilets.
- Do not rely on bath support rings or seats to keep your child safe in the tub.
- Use toilet locks so children cannot open the lid. Children age 4 and under can drown in just one inch of water.
- Empty all buckets immediately after use and store out of your child's reach.

In and Around Pools:

- Empty and turn over wading pools immediately after use.
- Enclose your pool or spa with fencing at least five feet high with self-closing and self-latching gates.
- Learn CPR and keep rescue equipment, a telephone and emergency numbers beside your pool.
- Teach your child to swim, but never rely solely on swimming lessons to protect them from drowning.
- Teach your child never to run, push or jump on others around water.

In Open Water:

- Never allow young children to swim alone. Make sure older children always swim with a buddy or adult.
- Be sure your child wears a life jacket when on a boat or near water and that it fits correctly. [Click here for mandatory lifejacket requirements.](#)
- Make sure children swim in designated areas in open water. Look for clear water with little or no current and check the depth of the water before swimming.
- Alcohol use while around the pool or open water impairs your judgement and may slow your reaction time, creating a safety hazard for you and your family.

Avoiding Water Related Illnesses

- Never swim within 48 hours of heavy rainfall in the Bay or other natural bodies of water.
- Natural waters are never completely clean so shower as soon as possible after water exposure.
- Cover open wounds and clean injuries immediately if they come in contact with natural bodies of water.
- Check for recreational water closings and safety messages or call 410-222-7999.
- Avoid drinking or dunking in natural bodies of water. Don't forget to let water drain from ears when drying off.

- If you have a chronic condition like diabetes, liver disease or HIV, talk to your doctor before participating in water recreation.
