News of the deaths of two Bay Hills residents reached us through the *Capital* newspaper. Nancy Bunnemeyer of Bay Green Court died on July 1st of complications from pneumonia. She was a member of Epiphany Eucharistic Community in Annapolis, the Annapolis Democratic Club, and the Annapolis Digital Photography Club.

On July 5th, Mary Marsh of Bay Green Drive died after suffering a stroke. Mrs. Marsh worked on numerous Maryland State Advisory Committees involved in conservation, environmental, and ecological issues. She was a County Council candidate for our district in 1998. She also was involved in planning the latest Broadneck Small Area Plan.

Congratulations are in order for Bay Hills residents who achieved inclusion in the Broadneck High School honor roll for the fourth marking period. Heather Franceschini and Elizabeth Nonemaker were named to the superintendent's honor roll. Matthew

Doster and Alyssa Haglund made the principal's honor roll.

New signs have been erected in several community areas stating that the facilities are for Bay Hills residents and their guests only. The areas are the pavilion/playground area on Bay Hills Drive, the basketball courts on Bay Green Drive, and the field off Shore Acres Road (behind Golf Course Drive and Court).

As we prepare for schools to reopen, it is again time to remind our residents to drive carefully and watch for children going to and from school. In Bay Hills, morning bus routes begin at 6:30 am, and afternoon bus routes run through until late afternoon. Please remember that Maryland law requires motorists to bring vehicles to a full stop 20 feet from a school bus when the bus' red alternating flashing warning lights are in operation. This law applies to vehicles meeting or overtaking a school bus from either direction.

Minutes of Board Meeting - July 10th, 2007

The July Board meeting was held on July 10th, 2007 at the Providence Center. It was rescheduled due to several members being unavailable on July 3rd. Although a quorum was not present, the meeting was called to order at 7:50 pm by President Pat Nolan. Also present were Jeff Burkhart, Lois Findlay and Dave Coutts. Jennifer Waters attended as guest. Lisa Francheschini resigned as an At-Large Member of the Board.

The Board approved the minutes of the May meeting.

Annual dues for 2007 have been paid by 98% of homes and both apartment complexes. The Board reviewed the status of the remaining 15 accounts, and approved sending them to our attorney for collection per Final Notice letters sent in late May. Treasurer is meeting with Bay West on July 11th to review the

accounts and reporting. Total dues collected of \$44,684 include current year dues, prior year dues and late fees.

A comparison of YTD revenues (\$52,014) and expenses (\$37,368) as of 7/10/07 with the 2007 budget was provided. The expenses include a \$5,000 transfer from the operating budget to the capital reserve fund.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Communications: Jennifer Waters is continuing to research the most cost-effective means of mailing the Beacon, given the recent postage increase (e.g., folded vs. flat). The timing of delivery was also discussed.

Covenants: A fence proposal for 523 Augusta was reviewed and approved. A reoccurring commercial sign on Bay Green Drive was raised for a notice letter, as well as a warehouse business being run on Brassie Court.

Property & Grounds Management: Pat reported that two pine trees were removed from in front of the basketball courts due to boring damage. The remaining trees were sprayed at the roots to ward off the boring insects. Dave Eckels is having new signage made for the recreational facilities.

Recreation: Dave Coutts noted that a corner of the tennis court fence is in need of repair. He will look into repairing it. Lois

Building a Fence, Shed or Other Structure?

The following are some guidelines regarding fences, sheds and other structures to be built on lots within the community:

- Any structure proposed to be erected upon any of the lots in the subdivision must be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval.
- The Board of Directors requires that all applications be accompanied by written statements of position concerning the request from the adjacent neighbors.
- The Board of Directors reserves the right to disapprove any submission deemed not to be in the best interest of the community as a whole.
- Fences will be approved providing they extend only to the rear line of the house. No fence is to be built so that it would project beyond the front line of any adjacent

residence. The fence height is limited to six (6) feet. The fence must have a consistent finish and not be left partially painted or stained and the finished side of the fence must face the public view. No chain link fence will be approved. No fences constituting an enclosure of the front yard will be approved.

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Back to School

Helpful Information from the Federal Citizen Information Center

As summer vacations come to an end, students are readying themselves for the start of a new school year. As you prepare to send your child to school arm yourself with some helpful health and safety information.

Top 5 Causes of Missed School

Children in large groups are breeding grounds for the organisms that cause illness. Here is a lineup of the top five infectious illnesses that keep kids home from school and child care.

Colds: Children typically have six to ten colds a year and also tend to have more severe and longer lasting symptoms than do adults. The good news is that you or your child should be feeling better in about a week. If symptoms aren't improving in that time, see your doctor to make sure your child doesn't have a bacterial infection in the lungs, sinuses or ears.

Stomach Flu: The second most common childhood illness is gastroenteritis, more commonly known as the stomach flu. This illness can lead to dehydration. Signs and symptoms of dehydration include: excessive thirst, dry mouth, severe weakness or lethargy, nausea or vomiting.

Ear Infection: Middle ear infections occur most often in babies and children between the ages of 4 months and 5 years. Most children have had at least one ear infection by the time they're 3 years old. It can be difficult to distinguish between ear infections caused by bacteria and those caused by viruses. For most otherwise healthy kids over 6 months of age, watchful waiting is a reasonable choice for suspected ear infections. They often clear up without antibiotics. But this may

not be the best option for every child. If your child has recurrent ear infections, hearing loss or other health conditions, your doctor may suggest antibiotics or ear tubes.

Pink Eye: Also known as conjunctivitis, it is an inflammation of the clear membrane that covers the white part of the eye and lines the inner surface of the eyelids. When caused by viruses or bacteria, it is highly contagious. Warm or cool compresses may ease your child's discomfort. Signs and symptoms of pink eye include: redness and or itchiness in one or both eyes, blurred vision and sensitivity to light, and tearing.

Sore Throat: Dry scratchiness and painful swallowing are the hallmarks of a sore throat but it is most often a symptom of another illness – usually a viral infection such as a cold or the flu. Most sore throats usually go away on their own in a few days. Only a small portion of sore throats are the result of strep throat. Strep throat is most common in children between the ages of 5 and 15, but can affect people of all ages. Fevers above 101°F are common in strep throat, and swallowing can be so painful that your child may have difficulty eating. Antibiotics are required to combat strep throat.

Note: The single most important thing your child can do to prevent illness is to wash his or her hands thoroughly and frequently. Despite your best efforts, your child is going to get sick – especially during his or her first few years of contact with larger groups of children. But a child's immunity improves with time. School-age children gradually become less prone to common illnesses and recover more quickly from the diseases they do catch.



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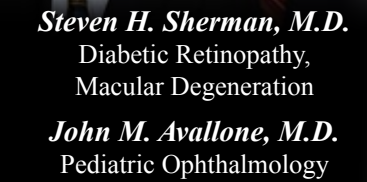

Healthy Sleep

Children's health and behavior take a nose dive when their sleep habits are out of whack. Adequate sleep will boost your child's energy and enthusiasm. Good-quality sleep also can help your child learn more easily and reduce many behavioral problems.

How Much Is Enough? Generally, between the ages of 6 and 9, most children need about 10 hours of sleep a night, while preteens need a little over 9 hours. Your child may require more sleep if he or she:

- Has a short attention span, or is irritable or restless
- Has unusually low energy and activity levels
- Is more tearful, anxious, defensive or impatient than usual

Sleep Tips for Your Children

- Set a regular time for bed each night and stick to it
- Avoid feeding children big meals close to bedtime
- Avoid giving anything with caffeine less than six hours before bedtime
- Make after-dinner playtime a relaxing time
- Establish a calming bedtime routine

Note: Each child is different and has his or her own way of approaching sleep. Some take extra time to fall asleep, while others wake more often during the night. You know your child's personal habits best, so with a little trial and error, you should succeed in finding a routine that suits your family.

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Nutrition Points

Eating right will help provide the nutrients needed to have energy, build strong bones, and fight diseases and other conditions. Pay attention to what and how much your kids eat. A change in eating habits may be an early warning signal for other problems.

Snacks - Plan Them, Don't Ban Them! Unfortunately nearly one-fourth of kids' daily energy intake comes from nibbling between meals. Much of this nibbling is on prepackaged snack foods, which are high in calories and low in nutrients. But snacking itself isn't necessarily bad. Young children actually need snacks. Their stomachs are small, so they often can't get all the nutrients they need in a day through meals alone. It's not always easy to persuade your kids to eat healthy snacks and their snacking habits aren't going to change overnight, but here are a few snack-time tips:

- Offer similar choices. Instead of ice cream or pretzels, offer your child frozen yogurt or soda crackers.
- Provide variety. Be sure to select snacks from a variety of food groups so your kids won't be bored with their snack choice.
- Be creative. Dress up fruits and vegetables – offer celery with peanut butter, or carrots with a low-fat dip.

Fruit Juice - Friend or Foe? Although juice does contain some healthy nutrients, it's high in calories and it may contribute to weight gain and tooth decay if consumed in excess. Some juice drinks, even those with 100% juice, have more calories than sugary carbonated beverages do. Juice also lacks the healthy fiber that whole fruit has.

Note: The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that children drink no more than two 6-ounce servings of fruit juice a day.

Get Moving

Kids can choose any type of moderate or higher intensity physical activity, such as brisk walking, playing tag, jumping rope, or swimming, as long as it adds up to at least one hour a day. Work with your child's school to ensure the activity is age appropriate and, to ensure safety, provide protective equipment such as helmets, wrist pads, and knee pads to prevent sports injuries.

For children and adolescents, regular physical activity has beneficial effects on the following aspects of health:

- Weight
- Muscular strength
- Bone mass
- Anxiety and stress
- Self-esteem

Note: It is recommended that children and adolescents participate in at least 60 minutes of moderate intensity physical activity most days of the week.

Backpack Safety - a Few Simple Tips

- Pack light – a backpack should never weigh more than 10 to 20 percent of the student's body weight.
- Organize the pack to make use of all compartments and pack heavier items closest to the center of the back.
- Choose a pack with wide, padded shoulder straps and a padded back.
- Use both shoulder straps. Slings a backpack over one shoulder can strain muscles and may increase curvature of the spine.

The March Board meeting was held on March 6th, 2007 at the Providence Center. The meeting was called to order at 7:35 pm by President Pat Nolan. Also present were Jeff Burkhardt, Dave Eckels, Lois Findlay and Dave Coutts. Jennifer Waters attended as guest.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The March Treasurer's report was published as presented at the meeting in the April 2007 issue of the *Beacon*.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Communications: Jennifer Waters set up e-mail addresses for Board officers on the community web site (e.g., president@bayhillsonline.com). She also set up an e-mail list that community residents must subscribe to, as explained in the *Beacon*. She noted two *Beacon* advertisers had overdue amounts for their advertising.

Covenants: An issue with residents on Mystic Lane was discussed.

Property & Grounds Management: Dave Eckels presented recommendations for spring landscaping and hardscaping improvements for community facilities. He provided estimates from G.P. Landscaping for this work. The Board voted to complete the following projects: 1) add rip-rap to gulley at basketball courts and limp up pines (\$770); grading, seeding, sodding and plant Crape Myrtles at tennis courts (\$2,700); stabilize around volleyball court, plant flowers and add sand (\$2,325); cut path into recreation area on Shore Acres field (\$2,500). Dave also mentioned getting bids from G.P. Landscaping and Homestead Gardens to clean up around the tennis courts. He is also getting prices on new signage for the recreational areas. The Board discussed installing permanent trash cans at the basketball courts.

Recreation: Dave Coutts has been in touch with Sally Vavrek about organizing a youth tennis clinic in June. Payments will be made directly to the instructor, Mike Hudson. The Board discussed insurance coverage for the event. Lois Findlay agreed to contact the State Farm insurance agent to confirm the coverage.

OLD BUSINESS

The next Traffic Committee meeting is March 15th at 7pm at the Providence Center. The dumpsters are scheduled for June 9th-10th. The community Yard Sale will be April 21st, advertised in the *Pennysaver* and noticed in the *Beacon*.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 pm.
